Impact of the Proclamation

- No slaves actually gained ______from EP
 - It applied to states that were not in the Union- they ignored it
- It did change the goal of the war- save Union AND end slavery
- South looked at it as the North trying to destroy

African American Contributions

- Behind Confederate Lines
 - Even tho blacks were still forced to work- many _____or worked ______
 - Hoped to hurt Southern war effort
 - 1000s would run as soon as a Union unit appeared
 - By the end of the war, about ______ of the slave population had escaped to freedom
