LIVING IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA TODAY

- The Free Market Economy
 - People are free to buy, sell, and produce whatever they want and work where they want with limited gov't interference
 - 2 groups- businesses and consumers
 - Businesses try to sell things that will give them profits, consumers shop for the best value at the lowest price
 - People also buy stock- part ownership in a company- risks
 - People are free to put money in a bank- government guaratees protection
 - Certain areas become known for certain production based on local resources

The Northeast

- Several large urban areas- business and trade
- NYC- financial and media (communications) companies
- Boston- biotechnology- study of cells to find ways of improving health

The Midwest

- Rich soil- corn, wheat, soy beans, etc
- Minerals and manufacturing- Detroit and Cleveland
 - Many became outdated and closed down

- The South
 - South- heavy on agriculture
 - Houston, Dallas, ATL- textiles, electrical equip. computers, airplane parts
 - TX, LA, AL- oil; FL- tourism and trade
- The Interior West
 - Outdoor activities
 - Used to be mining, raching, etc; now cities like Denver and Salt Lake City (info tech) and Albuquerque and Phoenix (tourism and service industries)

The Pacific

- Fruits and veggies in CA, OR, and WA- coffee and sugar in HI
- Natural resources- gold, oil, timber, fish
- CA- movie capital; wide ethnic diversity- nearly half Latino or Asian American
