

#### Pennsylvania and Delaware

Penn's " " Arrived in 1682- established Philadelphia Created pamphlets in several languages and Settlers came from all over Wanted PA to be a place where people of different backgrounds could live in harmony Penn wrote Required colonists to for Native land

Better relationship between colonists and Native in PA than other

colonies- still not good
