 - groups of rebellious colonial leaders in port cities
 - Threatened ______ that brought in tea

 - Most large port cities (NY, Philly) no tea was unloaded
 - Boston- _____ refused to give ships papers to let them return to England until
 - Dec 16, 1773- large group of men
 go aboard ship and dump
 90k lbs of tea into harbor
 - Equivalent of \$1.36 million

The Shot Heard Round the World

- Five miles from Boston- ______- 77
 minutemen intercepted British soldiers
- Brits ordered militia to go home- they ignored
- Someone fired a shot- no one knows who- eventually
- Another battle broke out in Concord- 400 minutemen
 - Killed 3 British
 - British retreat
- Attacked the entire way back by minutemen in woods
