- A Struggle Over Lands
 - Many ______ were attacking settlements in NW Territory in 1780s
 - Often joined together
 - Many American leaders thought America's success depended on _____
 - Bought most of land from Native Americans in TN and KY
 - North of OH River Natives refused to sell land
 - White settlers moved in anyway

- A Series of Battles
 - 1790- GW sent a small army to end Native attacks in NW Territory
 - Native armies led by _____(Miami) and ______(Shawnee) defeated US Army
 - A year later, GW sent larger army- again, Natives won
 - Killed over 900 American soldiers-

- GW sent general ______ to end the fighting
- Native Americans gathered at a field with fallen trees everywhere- thinking it would be an advantage
- Wayne and his army defeated Natives- known as
- Ended NW hold by Natives

_____-- Natives gave up most of land north of Ohio River to Lake Erie (now state of OH)

The French Revolution

- Began in 1789- many Americans felt France was going through the same thing they had and so they supported it
- Became controversial:

- 17000 people were put to death by Revolutionaries, including king and queen

- Federalists thought this was
- Republicans (including Tjeff) said that when people fight for freedom some injustices had to happen

The French Revolution

- By 1793-
 - GW said America should stay neutral
 - US wanted to ______ with both
 - Both worried trade with US would benefit the other
 - Started capturing US ships and seizing cargo
 - British began impressment of US sailors
 - Hamilton urged GW to stay friendly with Britain- said trade with Brits allowed US prosperity (purchased 75% of US products and sold 90% of US imports)

The French Revolution

- GW sent ______ to help solve problems with Britain
- Came back with a Treaty of 1795
 - US would pay long due fees to British merchants
 - Brits would pay for seized ships, leave NW territory, and stop aiding Native Americans
 - Brits refused to
 - Republicans hated treaty, Federalists liked it
 - Federalists controlled Senate so it narrowly passed
