The Presidency of John Adams

#### **Troubles with France**

-The French expected America to help them in war with Britain -why? made France more angry- thought it put US on British side -French ignored a US diplomat that arrived in Paris and continued to seize US ships The XYZ Affair -1797- Adams sends a 3 person team of diplomats to France -France agents demand -US diplomats brought the bribe back to America- was made public -French agents names kept secret, listed only as Agent X, Y, and Z-

became known as

# Troubles with France

War Fever -XYZ Affair led many Federalists to -Adams asked Congress to increase size of military and create -1798-1800- US with France -many, including Adams, wanted to \_\_\_\_\_ -new French dictator was -Adams sent new crew to deal with Napoleon -bc he was busy with European war, he agreed to stop ships seizing American -angered many Federalists- split the party

#### The Alien and Sedition Acts

-war fever had divided the parties even further -Federalist fears of French revolutionaries led them to -felt to restore order they needed to control Alien Act of 1798 -alien -act made citizenship require a minimum of of living in US (instead of 5) -also gave president the power to any immigrant he felt was "dangerous"

# The Alien and Sedition Act

- -made it a crime to write or say anything insulting or false about President, Congress, or the government in general
- -1798 and 1799- 10 people convicted- mostly Republican printers and editors

# States' Rights

- Republicans hated A&S Acts- said it violated Constitution
- -at time, Supreme Court right to strike down a law unconstitutional was not clear
- Republicans brought up problems in state legislatures
- -James Madison wrote a resolution denouncing A&S Acts- passed in VA legislature
- -Thomas Jefferson wrote something similar passed by KY
- -became known as
- -said states did not have to obey federal law that was unconstitutional
- -no other states followed VA and KY
- -Alien Act was repealed in 1802, Sedition Act at 1801

# States' Rights

- -VA and KY Resolution did bring up a BIG issue
- -\_\_\_\_aka nullify- the right of a state to declare a federal law unconstitutional
- -reinforced states rights- the idea that the union of "these United States" was
- -this would be an issue for the coming 65 years
- -would be a major defense of slavery
