The Great Compromise

- New Jersey Plan
- -The VA Plan called for Congress representation based on by state
- -in other words, bigger population = _____
- -small states had a beef with that- wanted every state to have same # of votes
- -_____ (NJ)- new plan
- Congress would have 1 house- equal votes per state
- Congress had more power- raise money and regulate commerce
- -delegates were divided over this issue- some felt the convention would fail bc no one would agree

	-lower house, House of Representatives- based on chosen by ppl to serve 2 year
	terms
	-upper house, Senate chosen by state legislatures (changed)- 6 year terms

Debates over Slavery

- Three-Fifths Compromise
- -Southern states wanted to count ______ to determine representation in Congress
- -Northern states said no bc slaves _______
- -Compromise- each slave counted as _____ (ex: 500 slaves = 300 people)
- -gave the South more seats in the House
- -bad for slavery- made a distinction in the Constitution between "free persons" and "all other persons"

Debates over Slavery

- The Slave Trade
- -some delegates wanted to completely ban
- South protested that it would ruin
- Compromise- 20 years of slave trade could continue- in 1808 Congress could ban importing of slaves

A New Constitution

- -debate continues for weeks
 -_____ was appointed to write the final draft
 -Preamble mostly written by ______
- -shows the states as one- "We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union"
- -last day- Ben Franklin (sick) has a speech read
- -basically said, with all its faults, this Constitution was as good as it was going to get
- -after speech, the Constitution was signed
