
- Muezzin- man who calls Muslims to worship
- Calls out five times a day- God called Allah
- Mosque- Muslim house of worship
- During prayer, they kneel toward Mecca

- The Five Pillars of Islam
- Each is a sacred duty of all Muslims:
- Declaration of Faith- declare regularly that there is only one God and Muhammad is God's messenger
- 2. Prayer- pray 5 times each day, toward Mecca
- 3. Almsgiving- give alms (money that goes to the needy)
- 4. Fasting- fast during the daylight hours of the

The 5 Pillars of Islam



- 1. Shahada- Testimony and declaration of faith
- 2. Salah- Prayer 5 times a day
- 3. Zakat- 21/2% charity to the poor
- 4. Saum- Fasting during the month of Ramadan
- Hajj- Pilgrimage to Mecca at least once a lifetime

- The Quran- the holy book of Muslims
- Messages from God told thru Muhammad- including Islamic rules
- Written in Arabic- a common language of most Muslims
- Contains stories, promises, warnings, and instructions- like Jewish and Christian Bibles
- Muslims call Christians and Jews as "people of the book"regard Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jesus as important people in their religion

- The Role of Women
- Before Islam- women were not equal and little girls were not valued

- 656- Uthman- Muslim leader was assassinated
