





Renaissance Thought and Literature Spreads

- Johannes Gutenberg- German printer
 - Movable type- individual numbers and letters could be arranged and rearranged for printing
 - Printing press- used movable type to print books
- Along with changes in Italy, the Renaissance spread to northern and western Europe







Renaissance Thought and Literature Spreads

- Desiderius Erasmus (1466-1536)- Dutch
 - Applied humanism to religious thinking- Christian humanism
 - Roman Catholic priest
 - In Praise of Folly- poked fun at some Catholic practices- said
 - they had little to do with faith
 - Covered up corruption
 - Leading scholar in Greek and Latin

Renaissance Thought and Literature Spreads

- Sir Thomas More
 - Friend of Erasmus
 - Lawyer- influenced by Greek thinkers
 - Utopia- described a perfect world
 - pointed out imperfections in Europe
 - Separations between politically weak and powerful





Literature of the Northern Renaissance

- Francois Rebelais
 - French follower of Erasmus
 - Gargantua and Pantagruel
 - Uses comedy to express humanist ideas
- The Pleiade
 - 7 French poets- used Greek/Roman forms to create new poems in French- based on common themes
- Sir Thomas Wyatt and the Earl of Surrey
 - English- early 1500s
 - Created the sonnet
- William Shakespeare
 - English- 1564-1616
 - 37 verse plays- borrowed ideas from classics
 - Great characters- Romeo and Juliet, Hamlet, etc











Art of the Northern Renaissance

- Jan van Eyck
 - Flemish- early 1400s
 - Realistic portraits- bright colors- one of only a few from the Netherlands
- Albrecht Durer
 - German woodworker and painter
 - Late 1400s visited Italy- affected by what he saw- his work resembled Italian work
 - His works reflected the Reformation
