- Herodotus-
 - Wanted to find source of Nile
 - Turned around at rapids
 - Knew that without Nile we wouldn't have Egypt

- World's longest river-
- 2 sources-______ (Ethiopian highlands- rapids) and ______(East Africa- swampy and slow)
- Meet in Sudan- becomes the Nile

- The Nile Through Ancient Nubia
 - After Blue/White meet, Nile forms a 1000 mile S shape
 - Northern tip of S- Aswan, Egypt
 - This S was ______- an ancient region in the Nile River valley
 - 6 cataracts (______)
 - Between 1st and 2nd- Lower Nubia- little farmland, rarely rained- people live close to river
 - Between 2nd and 6th- Upper Nubia- 2 miles of farmland on either side of river- DOES rain- people planted in fall and harvested in spring

 - 700 miles from Aswan to Mediterranean
 - Narrow region of
 ______- 6 miles on
 either side of river
 - North- Nile spread to form fertile marshy area-
 - On either side of Egypt-
 - In far north- Nile splits into several streams- delta
